AN ORDINANCE

amending Chapter 2 of the City Code as it relates to membership requirements for the Commission on Cultural Affairs; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, Missouri, is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 2-232. Membership; appointment; qualifications; terms; vacancies.

- (a) The commission on cultural affairs shall be composed of twelve (12) members, appointed by the city council. Four (4) members Members shall demonstrate have-significant knowledge, and demonstrated-interest or expertise in one (1) or more areas of the arts, including music, dance, literature, visual arts, theater, folk arts, media arts, design and arts education. In making appointments, selection of members shall be made so as to encourage representation of the socio-economic, geographic, and demographic diversity of the community as well as representation of a wide-range of stakeholders within the community including business, neighborhoods, and nonprofit and educational institutions. Two (2) members shall be from the business and professional community, one of which shall be from a business or professional office in the Downtown Community Improvement District. Two (2) members shall be involved in education. One member shall be a lay person with no specialized knowledge in the arts. The commission shall have representation from at least four (4) of the six (6) city wards.
- (b) Appointments shall be for terms of three (3) years, or until a successor is appointed and qualified, except that appointments to fill vacancies shall be for unexpired terms only. Terms shall begin on November 1. No member shall serve more than two (2) consecutive full three-year terms.
- (c) Commission members shall be residents of Boone County with a minimum of nine (9) members also being qualified voters of the city. A member may not be a paid officer or employee of the city, be a party to any pending litigation against the city, or be an

elected public office holder. Members shall serve without compensation. At least nine (9
members shall be qualified voters of the city. The city manager shall appoint a staff liaison
to work with the commission.
