Customers with existing house collections services will automatically have that service continue when refuse cart collection begins. Customers who are physically unable to transport their refuse cart to the curb may receive house collection at the same service rate as curbside collection. For customers' and staff's safety, customers must put the refuse in the cart and leave the cart outside the house in an area that is accessible by staff for collection. Staff will not enter homes or garages to collect refuse carts, and staff will not collect bags. Requests for house collections must include certification by a licensed health care provider of the applicant's physical limitations.

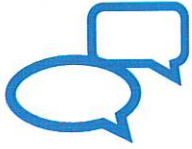

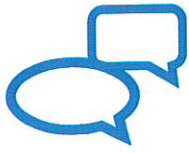
