Questions pertaining to the Proposed Round-A-Bout (RAB) at the corner of Katy Lane and Forum Blvd.

What is the estimated speed range (high to low) at which cars will exit the RAB coming off Forum Blvd going onto Katy Lane?

Where do you get the numbers that you use for the estimated speed range above?

How many feet between the RAB entrance onto Katy Lane and the start of the driveway at 1701 Katy Lane?

How far away will on-coming traffic traveling at the high and low end of the predicted speed ranges need to be identified by a driver to turn safely left onto Katy Lane from the driveway located at 1701 Katy Lane?

Does this change depending on the direction the car coming around the RAB is traveling?

When the garbage truck/mail man is stopped picking up trash carts or delivering mail will traffic be stopped and/or will traffic have room to pass without creating a dangerous traffic back-up on the RAB?

Given the falling grade from Forum Blvd precipitating the need to look in an upward direction... when snow is piled to the edge of the road 3 to 4 feet high or higher... will the line of sight be blocked from the 1701 Katy Lane driveway entrance looking back to see if traffic is coming off the RAB?

Will vehicles pulling trailers, Emergency Vehicles, Delivery Vehicles, Eighteen Wheeler Tractor Trailers, Construction Vehicles be able to turn on and off Katy Lane in and out of the Driveway?

To address safety concerns... we may need to reconfigure the existing 1701 Katy Lane driveway.

Possible reconfigurations might include a split driveway exit/entrance:

- 1.) Moving existing driveway exit as far west as possible in order to provide a safe entrance onto Katy Lane turning left.
- 2.) Adding a right in driveway exit-lane (Right In) off the RAB for vehicles to enter the driveway safely without coming to a complete stop and creating a traffic hazard.

The invasion and planned destruction of the trees lining West side of Forum Blvd.

From my conversations at the open house the other night I was told that from the current center of Forum which will consist of 2 yellow lines approximately a foot apart followed by Two 11 foot lanes and then One 8 foot bicycle lane and One curb and 6 foot sidewalk followed by an 18 inch level grade, followed by a 1 to 3 grade or a 3 to 5 foot retaining wall... for a grand total measurement of approximately 39 to 40 feet from the center of Forum Blvd or approximately 12 feet west off the outer edge of the existing sidewalk/ expanded shoulder on the west side of Forum Blvd.

If defined correctly above it raises concerns that the arborist has that a substantial number of Shagbark Hickory Trees as well as other trees will need to be removed... this does not seem to be the case if the center of the road is moved 8 feet to the east... and it appears that 8 feet of cleared space exists on the East side of Forum Blvd where tree removal would be unnecessary.

A retaining wall should not only be built to save additional tree removal it should also be designed as to deflect traffic noise east away from the residential homes to the west of Forum Blvd.

In the design you may want to consider granting a right in right out access to the buildable lot just North of 1701 Katy Lane. This would also save a lot of tree destruction when a future home is built there, that would otherwise require access to that lot from Katy Lane.

Miscellaneous

I do not know what requirements that the city places on Cable and internet providers to provide services to households however I know that even though cable and high speed internet wire exist in the ground and were put there when I built my house 19 years ago they are not connected on the other end and provide no service to my house or the other buildable lot... I thought I would mention this in the event that during construction this might be remedied... I also do not see lighting on any of the drawings provided online.

Ms. Anderson,

Thank you for your letter of November 8 and the opportunity to comment. Among the homeowners affected, the project could have more significant impact on my property than most of the others.

Without having been supplied with details of the project, I am left to speculate that the plan for the pedestrian paths will be similar to that which was proposed a few years ago. That project proposed that the path would run along the rear of my home and within a few feet of my back decks, even though there is more than a hundred feet of wooded land between my home and Forum. It was explained to me that the elevation of the land along my home was more compatible with making a connection to the bridge over the creek and remain compliant with ADA requirements. After a site visit by the Director of Public Works, he saw that the impact to my property was egregious and eliminated that part of the path from the project. Additionally, he determined that the part of the path by my home would not likely be used.

It was apparent to the Director and obvious to myself that the project was designed without a site visit and relied on topographical maps.

It is not my intention to oppose the entirety of the project. I hope that the project and be designed to accommodate the interests of the without devastating the enjoyment and value of my home.

Please consider these points:

A round-a-bout at the intersection of Woodrail and Forum will greatly improve the ease of turning onto Forum from Woodrail. This could also be accomplished by placing a stop sign for the northbound traffic on Forum at significantly less cost.

It is not clear that future traffic on Forum will require four lanes as the part of the city served by Forum is already fully developed and Forum, as it is now, handles that traffic.

A walking path that is within a few feet of my home invites access to my home. Indeed, it was the rear of my home that has been accessed by burglaries.

Traffic noise is already a problem. A noise barrier should be included in the project. Placing the walking path between a noise barrier and Forum would help address concerns of privacy, security as well as noise.

It has been mentioned that walking paths on both sides of Forum is being considered. This seems to be excessive and unnecessary.

Placing any walking path along Forum, rather than through the wooded area would preserve the mature hardwood trees that are further up the hill. - The path carled stay within the existing Risks of way and stall the line the 6 time to 6 time access. Thank you for your consideration of my concerns.

Mayor Buffaloe, City Council Members, and City Staff,

I attended the Interested Parties Meeting for the Forum Boulevard Improvement Project at Forum Boulevard Christian Church and 11/30/2023. I'm submitting comments on the project on behalf of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Commission.

The Commission endorses the following elements of the project:

- Addition of sidewalks and bicycle lanes on both sides of Forum Boulevard along the entire corridor of the project from Stadium Boulevard to Green Meadows Road
- An 8-foot pedway on the west side of the road and 6-foot pedway on the east side of the road
- New roundabout at the intersection of Forum Boulevard and Woodrail Avenue
- New roundabout at the intersection of Forum Boulevard and Katy Lane
- Ramps at roundabouts, where there are no dedicated bike lanes, so cyclists have the option of riding onto or off the sidewalk to negotiate roundabouts
- Striped crosswalks at roundabouts with pedestrian refuge islands in the middle of streets
- Extension of the existing pedestrian path south of the Forum Nature Area to allow safe merging to the new pedway

The Commission submits the following proposed changes for consideration:

- Consider widening the pedway on the east side of the road from 6 to 8 feet from Woodrail Drive north to the entrance to MAC / Wilson's Fitness Center and other businesses. Cyclists can achieve high speeds descending this hill. A wider pedway allows cyclists more leeway controlling their bicycles as they descend the hill.
- Signage or pavement markings approaching and exiting roundabouts giving direction to bicyclists that they have the option of riding on sidewalks to negotiate roundabouts

In discussions with Mr. Stone during the meeting, we discussed the City's schedule for sweeping bike lanes to keep them free of debris which is hazardous to cyclists using the bike lanes and can cause flat tires. He informed me that the ideal schedule is for bike lanes to be swept at 10-week intervals; however, the City is not necessarily adhering to this schedule. In order for people to adopt bike lanes, a regular maintenance schedule needs to be adhered to.

He also informed me the City has a fleet of four sweepers for bike lanes which are 9 years old and should ideally be replaced every 4 years. The estimated cost of new sweepers would be \$375,000 for a diesel sweeper; \$850,000 for an electric sweeper; and \$600,000 for a sweeper that could be used for a protected bike lane (where there is a barrier between the bicycle and car lanes).

It was a pleasure to meet you and discuss how to be address noise issues with the widening of Forum Blvd. Thank you for your time and consideration.

As I think more about the design and what I saw tonight, I am concerned that the right in, right out design at Wilson's/MAC on the south side of the bridge may not be the best design for safety and traffic flow. As currently designed, south bound traffic from the north that desires to turn into Wilson's will be required to travel up the hill to the Woodrail roundabout, go around the roundabout and head back down the hill in order to access Wilson's with a right-hand turn. This will, unnecessarily in my view, divert additional traffic to the Woodrail roundabout which will affect the ability to safely enter the roundabout from either the Woodrail or Lake Woodrail neighborhoods, and at times, cause unnecessary delay. In the winter it could have a significant adverse impact on traffic safety, especially in snow and ice conditions on the hill from Wilson's to the Woodrail roundabout as cars go up the hill and then down the hill. It also seems like a long way to have to go before turning around in order to get to one's destination.

In the interest of safety and reducing traffic congestion at the Woodrail roundabout, please consider adding a left turn lane from south bound Forum into Wilson's.

Also, we have no problem with ACoE representatives going on common property. We would like to be notified when they will be inspecting the drainage flow.

First of all, I generally like the design. The use of roundabouts here is smart and should keep traffic flowing where appropriate while also slowing it down at crossings, keeping everyone safer. Also those combined with ramp cuts onto the sidewalk make traversal by bike much safer for those who may not be comfortable riding with vehicular traffic.

But please PLEASE change the bike lanes to either fully protected ones or shift bike traffic on to a wider sidepath. I know the city has always been reluctant to create protected bike lanes, but many other cities have figured it out and there are guides available from FHWA and NACTO. Especially with the speed of traffic along this stretch and the expansion to four lanes, protected bike lanes that provide full separation from much faster moving traffic are the ONLY truly safe option. The city has an opportunity to create a bike network here, that can safely connect more citizens to the trail access, as well as businesses in the area, but it will only be used that way if it's safe for the average citizen.

Also sidewalks should be 8 feet instead of what appears to be 5 feet where right-of-way allows (which seems to be the majority of the corridor). This would match the existing sidewalk at Chapel Plaza Ct and the full sidewalk network north of the project corridor on Forum. If the city won't do protected bike lanes, then the sidewalks should be widened to a 10 foot sidepath (shared-use path).

I can see a 'right in right out' and a raised median to help prevent southbound drivers from turning left into the MAC. This area has been a point of congestion for a long while. Glad to see these boundaries in place for drivers, but what about pedestrians and bikers coming off the trail headed to the MAC? Will there be a way across for them?

MAC/Wilson entrance/exit

A roundabout at the Wilsons entrance seems more beneficial than at Woodrail.

Right-in/right-out at the MAC/Wilsons entrance seems like it would potentially increase congestion between Woodrail and Katy. Southbound drivers would need to travel past Wilsons to Woodrail, uphill to navigate the roundabout, and then backtrack downhill to Wilsons. Similarly, Wilsons patron who need to travel southbound when leaving would need to travel uphill to Katy, and then backtrack across the Hinkson Creek. That increases the amount of driving necessary, puts more cars in that LOS for a longer period of time, and forces greater congestion at the actual roundabouts.

Drivers going southbound on Forum would be delayed waiting at the roundabout at Katy for the drivers circling back to go southbound from Wilsons. That in turn pushes traffic further back up Forum, and the traffic light plus two-lane merge results in a lot of traffic in that specific LOS. A similar effect would occur for northbound Forum drivers at Woodrail in order to accommodate the drivers circling back to enter Wilsons, compounded by two lanes of southbound traffic coming up the hill, and drivers switching lanes to circle back. Northbound traffic may also be affected by slowing traffic at the bottom of the hill for those turning right to enter Wilsons.

With the reality of family sports events at the MAC, this seems like it could create a great amount of congestion due to multiple vehicles traveling north and southbound and needing to get in and out of that specific property, especially during evenings.

The proposed plan necessitates almost an additional .5 miles of travel for drivers in either direction. In addition, the sightlines of the winding road and heavy foliage on Forum mean that it could be difficult to see or anticipate traffic slowing ahead. That could increase the risk of auto accidents, especially during inclement weather. All of these factors together seem to increase the risk of congestion and collisions in the Forum corridor between Chapel Hill and Woodrail.

Road Widening = Road Will Be Less Safe; Protected Bike/Ped Infrastructure = Safety Options to Mitigate Increased Risks Caused by Project

One more lane in each direction will further entrench our car-oriented dependent development patterns. It will facilitate more conflicts with more cars on the corridor, leading to more potential crash opportunities. And time and time again, studies show that additional lanes can increase traffic. If this is what the city wants, more considerations need to be made for the bicycle riders and pedestrians that will be negatively impacted on this corridor by this decision.

With (1) a trail connection between residential areas to our city's most popular trail, (2) a steep grade that slows bike/ped travel but speeds up car travel, (3) blind curves, (4) narrow travel areas, and (5) shade from the trees making the area fairly dark and tricky to see, all the points are there to demonstrate the dangerous nature of this roadway, and why we need to take further steps towards safety for this project.

Many other smaller American cities in conservative states have figured out how to include protected bicycle infrastructure for their vulnerable road users. It's time for Columbia to do the same--building upon the proven protected bicycle project on Walnut St. on the Hinkson Creek bridge. This is a perfect project to start to implement a vision for safer streets on a more impactful scale.
