




Q1 In which City of Columbia ward do you live?

We are spending millions on an airport that only benefits a small number of residents, all of whom have the financial means to choose other travel options. At the same time, we are completely neglecting our transit bus system, which serves people who do not have another transportation choice. The bus system is for many residents the only

means to get to and from work. My own family had to turn down job after job, because we could not afford reliable transportation and there was no bus service or safe bike route to get to those potential jobs. This meant we were constantly one eviction notice away from homelessness. If you want to reduce homelessness and increase City revenue at the same time, provide an adequate transit system and safe non-motorized travel routes for all our residents. I keep hearing that Columbia is not the "right size". I suggest you Google European cities of similar size and their transit systems and you can see this argument is just an excuse not to put funding where it's needed - our local transit system. For example, look at Goettingen, Germany, which has a population of 118,000 and serves the city as well as outlying areas with a great number of routes. Service runs roughly from 5:00 to midnight. We can most certainly do better than we are! In short, vastly increase funding for our bus system.
