D.1. Provide a summary describing the proposed project.

The City operates the Home Rehab and Energy Efficiency Program with an assistance limit of \$50,000 per address. The program addresses interior and exterior property maintenance violations, environmental and health hazards, accessibility issues, HVAC repair/replacements and cost effective energy efficiency issues. Complete home energy audits performed by program staff guide energy related rehab activities and provide two important economic benefits to homeowners. Once energy efficiency improvements are completed and verified, the homeowners are eligible for up to \$2,400 in granted energy efficiency measures.

Additionally, the monthly energy savings will provide economic relief to the home owners for the usable life of the improvements.

CDBG grants fund staff, training and project set up costs for Rehab, Home Ownership Assistance, Demolition, CHDO programs, administrative oversight for Services for Independent Living's Ramp and senior home repair programs, and direct project costs for the Home Rehab and Energy Efficiency Program. HOME funds are limited to Rehab project costs only.

All homeowners in the CDBG or HOME rehab programs receive one-on-one training with a housing specialist to educate them about general maintenance in and around their home, to assist in protecting the City's investment and ensure the durability of the improvements made.
