Smith needs a speed bump at the top of the hill we merge left on from Silverthorne, it's dangerous! Also needed a crosswalk to Louisville Park from Stoneridge and Breckenridge. Smith needs a stop sign for Breckenridge at Louisville. We walk from Louisville to Chapel Hill and there are always speeding vehicles from West Cliff to the Georgetown stop sign which is also often run through. Smith to Scott after the hill is not as problematic as there is only one merging street at the Parkway until you reach the commercial mess at Westbury. The fix on Louisville is tougher as there are many merging streets and driveways and folk are just driving too fast, some child is going to dart out in one of those neighborhoods and get hit. There is probably not enough traffic to justify a roundabout so that leaves us with speed humps, I would focus on Chapel Hill to the Georgetown stop sign. As a resident of Stoneridge Estates, we were sent a letter from a couple individuals on the HOA board with opinions that do not coincide with a great number of the residents in this area. It indicated that their position was presented to the CPWD and they were asking only like-minded individuals to contact the city. Smith is like an arterial road with no driveways and no pedestrian traffic. It is not a residential street at all prior to reaching Breckenridge. Crosswalks, traffic circles, and medians would be overkill and would create traffic congestion where there is none. Has there ever been an accident or injured pedestrian on Smith? The items below address the comments from the letter.

- 1. While some sort of crosswalk at Smith and Louisville makes sense to complement the one already at Smith and Scott, adding more in between seems completely unnecessary. In 13 years, I never see anyone crossing Smith other than those 2 locations.
- 2. Traffic circles at T intersections or anywhere along Smith other than perhaps at Dayspring near the new commercial area are completely unnecessary and would create more traffic flow issues. That would be wasteful overkill.
- 3. Adding medians where there is no foot traffic is an unnecessary expense.
- 4. Bike lanes would be fine. I seldom see a bike on Smith (maybe once every couple months, and I walk it daily), but they wouldn't cause a problem and might encourage use.
- 5. Adding sidewalks where there aren't any makes sense, however sidewalks are already on both sides for the meager foot traffic that utilizes Smith (and I'm one) except for a small stretch at the east end.

We haven't had an opportunity to prepare a coordinated effort like the letter sent through the HOA, but hopefully there are others that have made their opinions known.

We are MUCH more concerned about the impact of traffic from all of the new apartments and businesses being constructed north of Smith and West of Scott in Westbury. this will create a hugh traffic jam on Smith and Scott, especially in the morning and evening rush hours. Only have limited left turn capabilities out of Westbury onto Scott. Most exits are right turn onto Scott. And the increased traffic from the apartments onto Smith will create hazards.

Smith already has a speed hump at the Louisville intersection. Its location seems to be of little to no benefit. Would have been better if had been farther from Louisville. The only addition we would suggest is another speed hump near the Stone Valley Parkway might slow Smith traffic enough to avoid accidents with traffic entering and exiting Smith from Westbury.

ALSO, Louisville is the thoroughfare for most traffic between Smith and Chapel Hill. The 4 way stop at Georgetown should only be a 2 way stop. Georgetown should stop and Louisville should not. This would allow easier navigation for traffic to get into and out of these neighborhoods.

AND, We also recommend that the 4 way stops all along Georgetown be reevaluated. Only the cross streets should have stop signs. This would allow Georgetown to be easier to navigate and would not increase risk. It is a real irritation to have to stop at almost every block when trying to use Georgetown to get out of these neighborhoods. And a waste of gas to stop and start over and over again. This leads to people that use it on a regular basis to cost and not stop. So may as well be a 2 - way stop. This also might encourage people to use Georgetown more and take some traffic off of Louisville.

Hi Dana,

Thank you for letting me know about the mishap. I am strongly in favor of traffic calming for Smith and Louisville. I have lived immediately adjacent to Louisville for approximately 7 to 8 years and daily use both streets. On both, drivers often exceed the posted speed limits, with Louisville being the worst of the two. At best drivers regularly drive in the 40 mphs, but it's not uncommon to see drivers exceed 50 mph down these stretches due to their uninterrupted length. Given the streets' proximity to a park and neighborhoods full of families with children, it is a surprise that there has not been a serious accident between a driver and a pedestrian. At least two to three times a year, I experience drivers recklessly passing me at high speeds on these streets while I go the posted speed limit.

I often see the roads used by cyclists, runners, and crossed by children on bikes, scooters, sometimes accompanied with adults, and sometimes not. The extension of the city's trail system just down the hill from the Chapel Hill / Louisville intersection will undoubtedly also increase the volume of non-vehicle users.

The city should use all its resources available, be it speed humps, speed tables, stop signs, or even traffic circles to slow down and help force drivers to safe speeds suitable for an area hosting a park and residential neighborhoods.

We, the Board of the Stoneridge Homeowners' Association, support the proposed Smith-Louisville Traffic Calming Project. Our neighborhood is North of Smith Drive, from Stone Valley Parkway to Silver Thorne Drive, and therefore adjacent to Smith. All traffic in and out of our subdivision uses the affected streets.

Recent development of the Breckenridge and Westbury projects has increased traffic next to our neighborhood. Smith Drive is a particular problem because:

- (1) Drivers' sight lines on Smith look like wide-open spaces, leading to excessive speeds. Eighty per cent of the vehicles exceed the posted speed limit on Smith.
- (2) There are "T-intersections" at Louisville, Silver Thorne, Somerset and Dayspring Drives. There are no crosswalks at the T-intersections, so there is no way for pedestrians, children, or disabled individuals to cross Smith safely.
- (3) Louisville Drive intersects Smith within 100 ft of Silver Thorne Drive, creating a uniquely hazardous situation. This is especially hazardous in winter weather, since the approach at Silver Thorne goes downhill. The existing stop sign on Louisville at Smith is often ignored by Northbound drivers.
- (4) The intersection of Smith with Stone Valley Parkway/Windermere Drive has no crosswalk or signal. It will get even more traffic as Westbury funnels traffic from car-centered businesses onto Smith.
- (5) The hill on Smith creates a blind spot for cars and, combined with excessive speed and the already hazardous intersections, means that a serious crash is waiting to happen.
- (6) The lack of sidewalks on Smith between Stone Valley and Scott forces pedestrians, joggers and disabled individuals into the traffic lanes.
- (7) Smith and Louisville Drives carry substantial bicycle traffic, since they lead to a popular route to McBaine and the MKT trail. This will increase as new City trails are developed North-South along Perche Creek, yet the intersection with Smith does not have a bicycle lane but instead funnels cyclists into the traffic lanes.

The Board has taken the position that the traffic calming project should include the following:

(1) Raised and HAWK-signaled crosswalks (HAWK = High Intensity Activated crossWalK) at all intersections on Smith between Scott and Louisville to allow pedestrians to cross.

- (2) Traffic circle ("mini-roundabouts") with plantings to reduce the feeling of "wide-open spaces" at Smith and Louisville, Stone Valley/Windermere, and perhaps elsewhere.
- (3) Medians on Smith to supply safe pedestrian stopping points.
- (4) Visible painted bike lanes on both sides of Smith.
- (5) Safe crossing for Eastbound cyclists at Scott.
- (5) The requirement that property owners immediately install sidewalks with a grass verge on Smith, whether or not a tract is developed.

Following are my suggestions for Smith Drive:

Intersec on of Smith Dr. with Stone Valley Parkway/Windermere Dr.

- 1. Add stop signs in both direc ons on Smith Drive. This would make it a four way stop when combined with the exis ng stop signs on Stone Valley Parkway and Windermere Dr.
- 2. Add four cross walks (painted) in all direc ons at this intersec on. Two on Smith Dr., one on Stone Valley Parkway, and one on Windermere Dr.

Add a sidewalk on each side of Smith Drive going westbound from Sco Blvd. to where exis ng sidewalks exist.

The crest of the hill on Smith Dr. creates a blind spot and can be dangerous, par cularly with cars turning onto Smith Dr. from Silver Thorne. Add a speed bump (not hump) at the top/crest of the hill. Add street signs in both direc ons making drivers aware of the speed bump and possibly a reduced speed limit.

The Intersec on of Smith Dr. and Louisville Dr.

- 1. Add a stop sign on Smith Dr. exi ng the Breckenridge subdivision. This is the intersec on of Smith Dr. and Louisville.
- 2. Add 2 crosswalks (painted) at this intersec on where the stop signs are. One crossing Louisville and one crossing Smith Dr. (the Breckenridge entrance side)

Please do not install any mini roundabouts (traffic circles). The mini roundabouts are too difficult to maneuver, par cularly with larger cars, SUVs and Mini Vans. I imagine school buses, UPS vehicles, snow plows... would have a difficult me as well. An example of a mini roundabout that is difficult to maneuver is the one on Fairview.

Following are my suggestions for Smith Drive:

Intersec on of Smith Dr. with Stone Valley Parkway/Windermere Dr.

- 1. Add stop signs in both direc ons on Smith Drive. This would make it a four way stop when combined with the exis ng stop signs on Stone Valley Parkway and Windermere Dr.
- 2. Add four cross walks (painted) in all direc ons at this intersec on. Two on Smith Dr., one on Stone Valley Parkway, and one on Windermere Dr.

Add a sidewalk on each side of Smith Drive going westbound from Sco Blvd. to where exis ng sidewalks exist.

The crest of the hill on Smith Dr. creates a blind spot and can be dangerous, par cularly with cars turning onto Smith Dr. from Silver Thorne. Add a speed bump (not hump) at the top/crest of the hill. Add street signs in both direc ons making drivers aware of the speed bump and possibly a reduced speed limit.

The Intersec on of Smith Dr. and Louisville Dr.

- 1. Add a stop sign on Smith Dr. exi ng the Breckenridge subdivision. This is the intersec on of Smith Dr. and Louisville.
- 2. Add 2 crosswalks (painted) at this intersec on where the stop signs are. One crossing Louisville and one crossing Smith Dr. (the Breckenridge entrance side)

Please do not install any mini roundabouts (traffic circles). The mini roundabouts are too difficult to maneuver, par cularly with larger cars, SUVs and Mini Vans. I imagine school buses, UPS vehicles, snow plows... would have a difficult me as well. An example of a mini roundabout that is difficult to maneuver is the one on Fairview.

Dear Public Works Department:

We, the Board of the Stoneridge Homeowners' Association, support the proposed Smith-Louisville Traffic Calming Project. Our neighborhood is North of Smith Drive, from Stone Valley Parkway to Silver Thorne Drive, and therefore adjacent to Smith. All traffic in and out of our subdivision uses the affected streets.

Recent development of the Breckenridge and Westbury projects has increased traffic next to our neighborhood. Smith Drive is a particular problem because:

- (1) Drivers' sight lines on Smith look like wide-open spaces, leading to excessive speeds. Eighty per cent of the vehicles exceed the posted speed limit on Smith.
- (2) There are "T-intersections" at Louisville, Silver Thorne, Somerset and Dayspring Drives. There are no crosswalks at the T-intersections, so there is no way for pedestrians, children, or disabled individuals to cross Smith safely.
- (3) Louisville Drive intersects Smith within 100 ft of Silver Thorne Drive, creating a uniquely hazardous situation. This is especially hazardous in winter weather, since the approach at Silver Thorne goes downhill. The existing stop sign on Louisville at Smith is often ignored by Northbound drivers.
- (4) The intersection of Smith with Stone Valley Parkway/Windermere Drive has no crosswalk or signal. It will get even more traffic as Westbury funnels traffic from car-centered businesses onto Smith.
- (5) The hill on Smith creates a blind spot for cars and, combined with excessive speed and the already hazardous intersections, means that a serious crash is waiting to happen.
- (6) The lack of sidewalks on Smith between Stone Valley and Scott forces pedestrians, joggers and disabled individuals into the traffic lanes.
- (7) Smith and Louisville Drives carry substantial bicycle traffic, since they lead to a popular route to McBaine and the MKT trail. This will increase as new City trails are developed North-South along Perche Creek, yet the intersection with Smith does not have a bicycle lane but instead funnels cyclists into the traffic lanes.

The Board has taken the position that the traffic calming project should include the following:

- (1) Raised and HAWK-signaled crosswalks (HAWK = High Intensity Activated crossWalK) at all intersections on Smith between Scott and Louisville to allow pedestrians to cross.
- (2) Traffic circle ("mini-roundabouts") with plantings to reduce the feeling of "wide-open spaces" at Smith and Louisville, Stone Valley/Windermere, and perhaps elsewhere.
- (3) Medians on Smith to supply safe pedestrian stopping points.
- (4) Visible painted bike lanes on both sides of Smith.
- (5) Safe crossing for Eastbound cyclists at Scott.
- (5) The requirement that property owners immediately install sidewalks with a grass verge on Smith, whether or not a tract is developed.
