Project name and brief description: <u>Stephens Lake Park Hindman Discovery Garden</u> Improvement Project: Park staff is proposing to use contract labor to replace the existing gravel walkway system throughout the garden with a combination of 6-foot and 8-foot wide concrete walkways. The gravel walkways in the garden require maintenance after every rain event and can result in uneven terrain for visitors to the garden. These conditions can create a safety hazard for visitors and ADA accessibility issues within the garden. The funding will allow for the replacement of approximately 750 feet of gravel walkway with colored concrete walkways. The reduction in gravel walkway maintenance will also allow staff to focus more time on landscaping maintenance at the garden. The project is identified in the City's FY-2023 CIP and funded by annual park improvement funds from the 2021 Park Sales Tax. Park staff anticipates completion of the work by summer 2023.
